Create an FSA ID. This account is simply a Username and Password needed to log into the FAFSA (and other areas of the Federal Student Aid website)

Parents need to create an FSA ID, too. At least one of the student's parents need to create an FSA ID Username and Password if the student is dependent. This is required to contribute their information to the student's FAFSA.

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid allows student applicants to apply for money from the Federal Government, the state they live in, the College they want to attend, and some need based scholarships.
